Approval of Minutes

- I. [21-6108](#) Approval of February 16, 2021 Minutes
A motion was made by Sheriff's Department Representative Lindsey, seconded by Legislative & Public Safety Committee Chair Calandro, to approve the February 16, 2021 minutes as presented. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

- II. [21-6109](#) Liquor Ordinance Article VI Section 5, B
Cervantez led a discussion on amending Article VI, Section 5, B of the Jackson County Liquor Control Ordinance to include restrictions on entry into a licensed premise for person 18 years of age or younger. The Board had a discussion about enforcement and how stringent they wanted to be with the ordinance. The Board made a motion to eliminate section 5 from Article VI and include the following paragraph in section 3: "No licensee, or agent, representative, manager or employee of such licensee, under no exception, shall permit or allow a patron under the age of twenty-one (21) years to sit or stand within five (5) feet of a bar when alcoholic liquor, including beer is served."
A motion was made by Legislative & Public Safety Committee Chair Calandro, seconded by Sheriff's Department Representative Lindsey, to approve recommendation to the full Board amending the Jackson County Liquor Control Ordinance to remove section 5 from Article VI and adding the proposed paragraph to section 3. The motion carried by unanimous vote.
- III. [21-6110](#) Additional Classifications for SSP Cave, LLC DBA Shawnee Cave Amphitheater
Larkin led a discussion about the need for additional liquor license classifications needed for SSP Cave. Scerena noted that there were no physical structures for the Health Department to inspect. Larkin questioned the need for structures and Scerena replied that structures are needed to ensure public safety and proper sanitation for health safety. Larkin commented that his intention was not to shut down SSP Cave , but to possibly suspend the current liquor license. He went on to say that SSP Cave could have liquor catered in by vendors who hold a valid liquor license and meet the Health Departments requirements. He noted this would be the safest way to handle the situation until structures could be built on the property that would meet the Health Departments inspections. The County Administrator commented that she would draft a letter for Larkin to sign noting the suspension. There was also a discussion about the temporary campground ordinance and that SSP Cave was covered for their upcoming event, but future
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events would not be able to have camping unless SSP Cave meets the State campground requirements.

Kinkaid Marina Additional Licenses

There was a discussion between the board members concerning the marina selling alcohol at several locations on the property, therefore requiring the need for additional liquor licenses. Scerena commented that the Health Department would need to do an inspection of the structures before liquor licenses could be issued. The State's Attorney stated that the marina needed 2 additional package licenses and that this would still allow patrons to consume liquor at their campsites.

A motion was made by Legislative & Public Safety Committee Chair Calandro, seconded by Sheriff's Department Representative Lindsey, to authorize the County Liquor Commissioner to approve Kinkaid Marina Additional Licenses upon meeting the full range of specs required by the County Ordinance. The motion carried by unanimous vote.
