III. 2024-1076 Addiction Treatment Resource for Jackson County, IL

They would like to see if a program could be started in Southern Illinois.

VI. 2024-1079 Mental Health Crisis Committee

Martin commented that the Carbondale Police Department and SIH partner together to work with organizations and clients who are high risk. They work together to discuss the best treatment options, essentially navigating people to the right resource.

Agency Reports and Updates

Archway, Centerstone, Shawnee Health, Southern Illinois Coalition for the Homeless, START, PJCAC, SICIL, Good Sam, Survivor Empowerment Center, and Take Action Today all updated the 708 Board on their respective agencies and answered questions from the board.

Old Business

VII. 2024-1080 Approval of Q4 Expense/Status Reports

The County Administrator commented that in the past, the 708 board had authorized her to approve the expense/status reports. She noted that this time, due to the way the dates fell, the 708 board could authorize them. She also commented that this was the final payment for FY24. VIII. 2024-1081 Reallocation of Survivor Empowerment Center Funding

The Survivor Empowerment Center asked to reallocate their 4th quarter funds and FY25 funds for a different purpose (formal request is in the meeting packet). The County Administrator commented that the 708 board needed to approve the reallocation. A motion was made by Flowers, seconded by Snyder, to approve the reallocation of Survivor Empowerment Center Funding. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

IX. 2024-1082 Approval of FY25 Meeting Schedule

A motion was made by Snyder, seconded by Martin, to approve the FY25 Meeting Schedule. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

X. 2024-1083 Approval of FY25 Funding Appropriations

The 708 board discussed the funding requests in detail and utilized the time to work out the funding appropriations with the budgeted amount provided by the Jackson County Board. They also asked questions from the County Administrator and the agencies. A motion was made by Turner, seconded by Snyder, to approve the FY25 Funding Appropriations in the following amounts : Archway \$22,270, Carbondale Warming Center \$85,000, Centerstone \$220,000, Good Samaritan \$20,573, Perry-Jackson Advocacy Center \$16,400, Shawnee Health \$70,850, SICIL \$9,033, SIU Clinical \$20,000, START \$73,488, Survivor Empowerment Center \$28,280, SIU EDC \$40,324, Southern Illinois Coalition for the Homeless \$14,782.

XI. 2024-1084 Approval of FY25 Contracts

A motion was made by Snyder, seconded by Flowers, to approve the FY25 contracts. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

XII. 2024-1085 1 and 3-year Goals

The County Administrator commented that this item could be discussed at the February meeting after the board had time to review the current goals and make suggestions.
